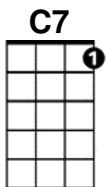
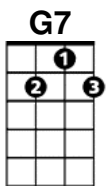
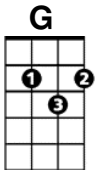
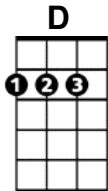
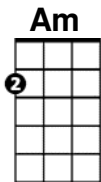
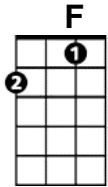
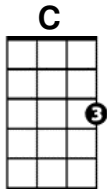


Amazing Grace
